Thought for the Week:

Please pray for our schools. As you may have heard, Primary schools are looking to go back (very littlies and Yr6 – those going to Secondary School next year) beginning after half term (1st June). Being married to a Headteacher I have had an insight into the million and one questions, concerns, frustrations, stress, and love so many of the staff have for the children and their wellbeing.



As we move from Easter to Pentecost, and from "Stay at Home' to "Stay Alert," there are likewise many questions, many concerns, quite a few frustrations, and a deep love for people wherever those early disciples went and as we look to our own unknown future.



What we can all learn from those early disciples, perhaps particularly this year, is to not only listen and react to the hundred and one voices out there, whether government departments, media briefings, endless amounts of comment, from TV, Social media, parents or whoever. May we also seek to listen to the



deep voice within – the God, "in a gentle whisper" as Elijah calls Him (when He meets with God in 1Kings 19:11-13). More powerful than the wind, more shattering than the earthquake, more healing than the fire. This, for me, is one of the key ways the Holy Spirit is able to speak in today's world and into our lives. We don't know when He will come, we don't always recognise it, at the time, when He does. But we know a peace, or a wholeness, or a right-ness, or a right-timing to what needs to happen or what we are to do next, even if it just to take the next step.

As we begin to look to the next great chapter in all our dramas, both individually and as a Church, may we walk with those early disciples, trust their wisdom, and seek to go forward not on our own, but by first seeking Him.
