St Andrew's Churches, Banwell and Congresbury

Sunday 24th May, Sunday after Ascension

Thought for the Week:

On Thursday (21st May) we celebrated Ascension Day – and we shared a Live Stream service from on top of Cadbury Hill on the edge of Congresbury so that we could see and pray for both communities in Banwell and Congresbury, and all points in between (Hewish and Puxton). It was our first attempt at an "outside broadcast," and we even had a 'virtual' coffee together afterwards. Thank you to all who joined in and to Kirsty and George for making it happen. Apologies for a few technical issues at the beginning.

So, now we are in this period of waiting; waiting for the Lockdown to begin to ease, waiting to celebrate Pentecost (Whitsun) — when we focus and celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, and waiting to see what God is going to do and the sort of Church we are going to be as we look to the brave new world that will be 'after Co-Vid 19.'

Into this mix, the Archbishops have launched this year's appeal to join them in praying the Lord's Prayer Together, for ourselves, for our communities, for the nation – it's called "Thy Kingdom Come."



Its now spread to many countries around the world as part of the wider Ecumenical Church and also the Anglican Communion. (You can find various resources on-line at www.thykingdomcome.global and there is also an App for your phone – simply search "Thy Kingdom Come" in your App Store). At its very heart, is the faithful praying of the Lord's Prayer – a Prayer we all know pretty much, one way or another (in the traditional form, the modern form, or perhaps even using Makaton sign language). But how easy it is just to recite it as part of a Daily Prayer, or as part of praying through the Prayer Diary? When was the last time we gave time and space to the Lord's Prayer, looking at what the words actually mean, and what it means to 'pray' these words through, rather than just recite them, in a relational way with God, who as Jesus encourages us to see as not just "Almighty," or "Universal Creator," but as "Father," "Abba," "Daddy?"

It's interesting, that as we look to the future, with so many unknowns and so many uncertainties, God in His wonderful provision, gives us the simple, and even the familiar and well-known things, to aid us most for the journey. The trick is to be willing to stop, be still, and humbly to be willing to value what God has given us, even if we think we know it so well, before then moving on. So, may this nine-days (between Ascension and Pentecost) or however long there is left in this time of Lockdown be for each of us, not a negative time, a wasted time, simply of waiting? May it be instead, a time of rich and deep learning, a time of renewal and refreshment, a time for valuing and preparing ourselves for the journey which is soon to come — whether we are talking about life in the spirit of those first disciples in the company of the Holy Spirit, or whether we are talking about life the other side of this virus, or both.

Have a good time with the Lord's Prayer and with "Thy Kingdom Come" and may our Risen, and now Ascended Jesus, renew and refresh your heart and mine through the words He so wonderfully gave us.
