

I'm On Empty

Thought for the Week:

As well as details about the beginnings of relaxation of the Lockdown, this week sees the celebration of Pentecost (or Whitsun, as some people know it) – the gift of the Holy Spirit, sent from God.

Now we can be carrying ten bags of shopping from the supermarket to the car, when someone offers us a hand (socially distancing, of course), and we say, "no, it's ok, I'm fine." We get home, carry the same bags from the car to the kitchen table, and then collapse, complaining to anyone who will listen, "what a hard job it is always having to go and do the shopping."

Similarly, we can be in the Doctors' Waiting Room, sat quietly waiting our turn. We then recognise the person across the way. They say, "oh, hi, how are you?" "Oh, fine," we reply. "And you?" "Oh, fine, fine," comes the reply. Yet inside, we are anything but fine.

I think it is something to do with these two emotional traits – a desire to measure wellbeing based on independence, which you could possibly call "pride," if you were being harsh, and a certain reticence to share our real self, which you could call "shyness" that lies at the heart of why we often have problems engaging with a meaningful relationship with the Holy Spirit, even if we have been seasoned Christians for many years.

That, coupled with images of doves or tongues of fire, together with certain styles of worship or forms of prayer that possibly seem far too expressive for a traditional village climate, all lead to solidifying our already formed impression.

And yet, now is a time, as we begin to look to emerge from Lockdown as a community and as a world, when we could all do with being renewed and refilled with the Holy Spirit, almost like never before. The timing couldn't be more appropriate. For, through all the layers of interpretation and styles of expression, the Spirit is the One who enables the creative and lifegiving presence of God to be with us, individually and collectively, right here, right now, in terms of clarity of thought, integrity, genuineness and humility, in terms of generosity, compassion and grace, in terms of companionship and courage to embrace change and attempt new things. The list of adjectives and benefits goes on and on. These all come as gifts from "the one and the same Spirit," says St Paul in 1Cor ch 12.

Why would we not want to engage with such a Helper, a Companion, a Comforter and a Friend, as we look to the future of a Britain and a world post-lockdown?

Perhaps, only because we quite like doing things the way "we" always do them, or because we have been hurt somewhere before and we hold everyone, even God at "arm's length" because it's safer that way.

Can I encourage, as many that are willing, however, to take this time, for forty days, from Pentecost (THIS Sunday – 31st May) till the 16th July, to join with me and others in an exploration of just how wonderful, diverse, creative and life-giving the Holy Spirit truly can be, not just in the Bible but in each and every day of this life, and in our present world. There is a little book that I have found personally very stimulating to help us to engage in this, like having a friend who's walked the footpath before us and also with us – it's called "40 Days with the Holy Spirit" by Jack Levison (see below). The "Daily Blog" on the New Creation Facebook Page will be based on his work each day – so look out for that (details below). I could almost guarantee that at the end of your 40 days you would not only have learnt something new about who the Holy Spirit can be, but also see your relationship with Him in ways that you would wonder why you had never seen it that way before.

And, even if you don't like reading, and you don't want to follow a five minute video blog, please join with me in letting your heart and soul breathe by praying this Sunday, and in the coming forty days, "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of all people and kindle in us all the fire of Your love. Amen."

Let us look to the ending of Lockdown and a life beyond not in pride, not in fear, but in companionship and love, themselves gifts of the Spirit.


