Walking In The Light

20/20 vision is probably something we've all heard, a phrase indicating perfect clarity of sight. During the year 2020, it may not have been always apparent. Circumstances have been far from normal, and there may have been times when we have felt that we were living through the perfect storm. So what do we need to be able to go boldly into 2021?

Firstly, in a world so seemingly full of chaos and confusion, we need to know where we stand. I'm reminded of Edward Mote's familiar words, "On Christ the solid rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand." We have seen news headlines change from day to day, even from hour to hour, during the last year. We need an anchor point, a firm foundation for our lives to stand firm, and Jesus provides that for us. He is unshaken by the shenanigans we have seen in politics around the world. He is not fazed by fake news. He is not caught up by conspiracy theories. He does not cower before Covid-19 or any other variant virus that rears its ugly head in our world.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life." He shows us the way to walk through life, even when the storm rages around us. He said the Holy Spirit would teach us the truth, so that "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free." He can inspire us to see through falsehood and avoid being bewitched by lies masquerading as truth. And he can share his perspective, so that at all times we can have wisdom and insight, and clearly see the way forward to enable us to take the next step.

Whatever 2021 brings, we need to have complete confidence in the God we worship. We need to stand together as God's people, supporting, encouraging and upholding one another in our faith. God knows what we will need, not just before we ask for it, but even before we have any idea that we will need it! The writer of Hebrews tells us to come boldly before the throne of grace so that we may receive all the help we need when we ask for it. Though it may seem at times we are living through dark days, by his word and his spirit God will light our path before us, so that we may walk confidently forward without fear of stumbling or going astray.
